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TN STATE POLICY FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

The Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission organized a "Consultative Workshop on preparation of T.N State Policy for Senior Citizens on 20th October 2015, under the Chairmanship of Tmt. Santha Sheela Nair, IAS (Retd), its Vice - Chairperson. Thiru Ashish Kumar IAS, Jt. Secretary to Government, Dept.of SW&NMP, gave a brief introduction about the draft TN State Policy for Senior Citizens. Govt Departments concerned with welfare schemes and projects attended the workshop and gave their views. From the non governmental side, eminent resource persons who made presentations on the subject include Thiru Edwin Babu, JD, HelpAge India, Thiru D. Rajasekaran, President, FESCATAN, Dr. Capt. M. Singaraja, Chairman, Senior Citizens Bureau (SCB) and Editor, "LinkAge" and Dr. Visalakshi Nedunchezhiyan, Chairperson, TN State Commission for Women. A summary record of the proceedings of the workshop has been released by the State Planning Commission recently, which briefs the presentations made at the workshop. Dr. Capt. M. Singaraja, Senior Citizens Bureau presented detailed page - wise observations and modifications to be made in the draft TN State Policy for Senior Citizens, 2015. He appreciated that the policy has been well drafted. He stated that lots of problems of Senior Citizens arise due to loneliness. He requested to incorporate the modifications in the draft policy as suggested by the Senior Citizens Bureau. He further recommended the following:

range of problems faced by the Senior Citizens community.

- There can be a significant logo in the Aadhaar Card of Senior Citizens distinguishing from others.
- · Separate ID cards to be issued to Senior Citizens like the one issued by Government of Karnataka.
- Separate counter/ queue for Senior Citizens in civic facilities like Ration shops.
- Govt. can run old age home not only for destitute but can even paid old age homes in public private partnership.
- Streamline public/private old age homes
- Reservation of seats in public places/Transport.
- · Government Palliative Care facilities are needed.
- Right to services to be enacted.
- Departments should treat the Senior Citizens with warm welcome and broad smile.
- The meals on wheels programme is going on well in Tenkasi. Government can think of running similar facilities through Tamil Nadu Amma Canteens.
- Free entry for senior citizens to public facilities like Zoo/Art Gallery/ Museum/ Government Functions etc.,
- · Mandatory observance of Older / Senior Citizens Day in all educational institutions.
- · National and State commission for Senior Citizens with Statutory powers.
- · State Council for Senior Citizens should be active and monitor.
- Extended service of 104 help line as mobile medicare unit.
- · Affordable health insurance schemes
- · Long term palliative care facilities
- Proper and complete implementation of MPWSC act.
